*Excellent deals, especially on previous-season models, and U.K. taxes removed before shipping. Small orders (e.g. a pair of cleats, one or two balls) have always arrived without customs charges. Beware, however, that large orders, such as a full sets of balls for all of the club's teams, are charged customs every time, making the order more expensive than it might have been through Soccerworld (at least, in my experience).*

*The Puma balls we got last year were from pro direct and were a very good deal. However, we were charged an astronomical amount by customs which made it more expensive than we expected, albeit still a decent price.*
